Weekly Poll Notes:

For the sixth consecutive week, the top three spots in the NABC/Division II poll have gone unchanged, with Colorado School of Mines still in the No. 1 position followed by Northern State and Northwest Missouri State.

The Orediggers returned to play last week with a pair of road wins to improve to 12-0 on the season, while Northern State was victorious in both of its weekend outings against Minot State and Northwest picked up three wins to stay at No. 3.

The first change comes at No. 4 after Lincoln Memorial's loss Saturday to Newberry, bringing West Texas A&M up to that spot and elevating the next three teams up one spot apiece. Truman State rose to fifth and is coming off a win Monday over the lone newcomer to this week's poll in No. 24 Southern Indiana.

Most of the teams in the poll this week stayed rather steady in their positions, with only DBU (to No. 12) and Flagler (to No. 18) moving up more than two spots. The only teams to drop were Findlay from 12th to 23rd after two losses last week, while two setbacks knocked Lee out of the rankings to allow Southern Indiana to join the top 25.

A total of nine conferences have multiple teams in the rankings this week, with four of them coming from the Lone Star Conference – all ranked among the top 13.

Saturday's schedule features four head-to-head matchups involving ranked teams, with two of them being the first meeting of the season between those squads:
