NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK – Tuesday, December 2, 2025

Jose Murillo of Eastern New Mexico University and Natalie Bremer of Minnesota State University have been selected as this week's national players of the week by the NCAA Division II Conference Information Directors of America for the week of Nov. 24-30.

MEN: Jose Murillo, 6-9, Senior, Eastern New Mexico

Hometown: Chihuahua, Mexico

Murillo averaged 18 points and 15 rebounds per game for the 5-1 Greyhounds in two wins last week and was also a defensive force in the victories over MSU Denver and CSU Pueblo. In ENMU's 78-65 victory over MSU Denver, Murillo had 15 points on seven-of-11 shooting from the field and pulled down 15 rebounds, while also adding three assists, two blocked shots and four steals. The following day against previously undefeated CSU Pueblo, Murillo recorded another double-double with 21 points and 15 rebounds, while also blocking four shots along the way. Those efforts helped the Greyhounds to hold their two foes to a combined 34.5 percent field goal percentage mark.

Murillo became just the third player in Eastern New Mexico history with multiple games with at least 15 rebounds in a career and is the only player in the Lone Star Conference averaging a double-double for the season (17.6 points and 10.2 rebounds per game). He was selected as the Defensive Player of the Week in the LSC.

WOMEN: Natalie Bremer, 5-11, Senior, Minnesota State

Hometown: Lake City, Minnesota

Bremer averaged 30 points, five rebounds and four steals per game in two victories for the Mavericks, which included a career-high 35 points in an 85-73 win over Wisconsin-Parkside. In that victory, Bremer went 13-of-22 from the field that included four three-point baskets, while adding four rebounds, four steals and two assists. Earlier in the week, she had 25 points on 12-of-23 shooting from the field with six rebounds and four steals as the Mavericks opened their Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference schedule with a decisive 110-81 win over St. Cloud State.

Bremer connected on 25 of her 45 field goal attempts (55.6 percent) and was five-of-nine from three-point range in the two games, while making all five free throw attempts and making eight steals. Bremer, selected as the NSIC South Division's Player of the Week, helped the 7-0 Mavericks to the two wins that allowed them to move up to second in this week's Women's Basketball Coaches Association's national poll.
