## NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK – Tuesday, December 9, 2025

Kyle Hrnrcir of Upper Iowa University and Bridie McCann of Nova Southeastern University have been selected as this week's national players of the week by the NCAA Division II Conference Information Directors of America for the week of Dec. 1-7.

**MEN: Kyle Hrnrcir, 6-5, Junior, Upper Iowa**

**Hometown: Farmington, Minnesota**

Hrnrcir averaged 23.3 points and nine rebounds per game to lead Upper Iowa to three wins to open its Great Lakes Valley Conference schedule, including a win over fifth-ranked Missouri S&T to close out the week. He started the week out with a 31-point, 10-rebound showing in a 96-92 overtime win at Quincy, where the Peacocks overcame a 16-point deficit with nine minutes remaining. Hrnrcir scored seven of his points in overtime, then followed that up with a 16-point, six-rebound effort with three assists in a 76-62 over Lincoln. On Saturday, Upper Iowa rallied from a 14-point deficit in the second half in the win over Missouri S&T, thanks to another double-double by Hrnrcir as he had a team-leading 23 points and 11 rebounds; he had 19 of his 23 points over the final 20 minutes.

Over the three games, Hrnrcir made 51 percent of his field goal attempts (24-of-47), three-of-10 on three-point attempts and was 19-of-32 at the free throw line, while adding seven assists, four steals and a blocked shot for the Peacocks, who are 7-1 on the year and 3-0 in the Great Lakes Valley Conference for the first time. He was named as the GLVC's Player of the Week for the second time this season.

**WOMEN: Bridie McCann, 5-6, Junior, Nova Southeastern**

**Hometown: Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania**

McCann helped lead the Sharks to a pair of Sunshine State Conference wins last week, including a victory over ninth-ranked Embry-Riddle when she scored a career-high 29 points and connected five times from three-point range in that contest. She went 11-of-22 from the field overall and added six rebounds, four assists and two steals in the 65-57 victory. Earlier in the week, McCann had 16 points on six-of-nine shooting – which included a four-of-six showing from beyond the arc – with a rebound, four assists and three steals as the Sharks downed Barry 86-77.

In the two games, McCann made 17 of her 31 field goal attempts (55 percent), nine-of-17 from three-point range and both free throws, finishing with averages of 22.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, four assists and 2.5 steals per game to earn the SSC's Player of the Week award. Nova Southeastern improved to 9-0 on the season with the two wins and moved up to seventh in this week's Women's Basketball Coaches Association's national poll.
