NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK – Tuesday, February 10, 2026

Bergan Kinnebrew of the University of Mary and Jaquay Randolph of Southern Wesleyan University have been selected as this week's national players of the week by the NCAA Division II Conference Information Directors of America for the week of Feb. 2-8.

MEN: Jaquay Randolph, 6-10, Jr., Southern Wesleyan Hometown: Tallahassee, Florida

A school record performance as part of a standout week earned Randolph the national honor this week, as he averaged 36 points, 13.5 rebounds, 1.5 blocks, 1.5 assists and a steal in two Southern Wesleyan (9-12) wins. After opening the week with a 23-point, 17-rebound showing in a 79-76 win over Barton, Randolph exploded for an SWU record 49 points in a 117-108 overtime victory over Chowan on Saturday.

Randolph went 17-of-23 from the field in the game – part of a week where he was 27-of-38 (71.1 percent) from the floor – and was also 14-of-19 at the free throw line. In that game, he scored nine straight points in an overtime stretch that allowed the Warriors to extend a one-point advantage to seven over the final 3:27. Randolph also had two assists, two blocked shots and 10 rebounds in the game, leading to his 17th double-double of the season that leads NCAA Division II. He was named as Player of the Week in Conference Carolinas.

WOMEN: Bergan Kinnebrew, 5-11, Jr., UMary Hometown: Bismarck, North Dakota

Kinnebrew helped lead the Marauders (20-7) to wins over Minnesota Duluth and Bemidji State by averaging 31 points, 3.5 rebounds and three assists per game, while also going 16-of-29 (55 percent) from the field and making all but one of her 29 free throw attempts in the two contests. In the 76-66 win over Minnesota Duluth, Kinnebrew posted her second-highest scoring total of the season with 40 points as she was nine-of-17 from the floor and 21-22 at the free throw line, including making all 16 attempts in the second half.

On Saturday in an 85-54 victory over Bemidji State, Kinnebrew recorded 22 points, four assists, two rebounds and a steal as she was seven-of-12 from the field that included a three-point basket and made all seven free throw attempts to help UMary (20-7) reach the 20-win mark. She set a new single season school record with 203 made free throws in a season in the process, which is also the most in NCAA Division II this season. The third-leading scorer in the nation at 22.5 points per game, Kinnebrew was selected as the Player of the Week in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference's North Division.
