NCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK – Tuesday, February 17, 2026

Izzy Moore of Northern State University and Spencer Swenson of the University of Minnesota Crookston have been selected as this week's national players of the week by the NCAA Division II Conference Information Directors of America for the week of Feb. 9-15.

MEN: Spencer Swenson, 6-7, Fr., Minnesota Crookston

Hometown: Sauk Rapids, Minnesota

Minnesota Crookston picked up a pair of wins last week largely behind the efforts of Swenson, who averaged 28 points and 10 rebounds per game while adding three blocked shots, two assists and a steal. He made 23 of his 35 shots from the floor (65.7 percent) and nine-of-11 at the free throw line (81.8 percent) in the victories over Minot State and UMary.

Swenson made nine of his 15 field goal attempts, including one from three-point range and six-of-eight at the line in Minnesota Crookston's 72-69 win over Minot State, adding seven rebounds, two blocks, an assist and a steal along the way. Two days later, Swenson posted a career-high 31 points and matched his season-best with 13 rebounds to help the Golden Eagles down UMary 71-66. He went 14-of-20 from the floor and made all three of his free throws to become the first player in UMC history with five consecutive games with 20 or more points. The double-double was the fifth of the season for Swenson, who was selected as Player of the Week in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference.

WOMEN: Izzy Moore, 5-10, Sr., Northern State

Hometown: Sioux Falls, South Dakota

Moore, the second straight player from the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference to earn the national honor, averaged 33.5 points and 9.5 rebounds over the course of road wins over Bemidji State and Minnesota Duluth last week that brought the Wolves to 15-11 on the season. She went 23-of-36 (63.9 percent) from the field, two-of-five from three-point range and 19-of-21 (90.5 percent) at the free throw line while adding an assist and a steal.

She began her week with a 26-point, 11-rebound performance in a 73-55 win at Bemidji State, scoring 11 of her points in the opening quarter to help the Wolves build a nine-point lead. Moore finished nine-of-17 from the field with one three-point basket and seven-of-eight at the line as she recorded her third double-double of the season. On Saturday in a 74-58 win over NSIC North Division leader Minnesota Duluth, Moore tallied a career-high 41 points – tying the second-most in a game in program history – as she scored NSU's first eight points and did most of her scoring damage in the second half when she had 27 of NSU's 39 points, including the last 12. Moore was selected as the Player of the Week in the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference's North Division.
