



National Association of Basketball Coaches NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Rankings

2014-15 Rankings – Dec. 2, 2014 (Poll #2)

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – West Liberty and Southern Connecticut State continue to lead the NABC/Division II men's basketball rankings, but losses by last week's third- and fourth-ranked teams have caused a shuttle at the top end of the first poll for December.

Last week's third-ranked team, Metropolitan State, fell to No. 6 Florida Southern and No. 4 Drury lost at Northwest Missouri State, moving Bellarmine up to No. 3 and Florida Southern to the fourth spot in the new rankings. Indiana (Pa.) also moved into the top five as a result of those setbacks.

Central Missouri moved up four spots to No. 6 this week, while Tarleton State and Colorado-Colorado Springs each moved up one position to seventh and eighth, respectively. Metro State's loss dropped the Roadrunners to No. 9, while Lincoln Memorial rounds out this week's top ten.

Augustana and Barry, who both remained undefeated through last week's play, made major vaults in the poll to 11th and 12th, while Minnesota State checks in at No. 13. Drury fell ten spots to 14th this week and Alabama-Huntsville – whose loss Monday at Trevecca Nazarene is not reflected in this week's rankings – is 15th.

Four newcomers to the top 25 are included in the next four spots, starting with Indianapolis at No. 16. California Baptist dropped from 11th to 17th and is followed by a trio of undefeated poll newcomers in Mount Olive, Minnesota State-Moorhead and Michigan Tech.

This week's final five teams are Findlay, Point Loma Nazarene, BYU-Hawaii, Christian Brothers and Florida Tech.

The next regular season poll will be released Dec. 9.
