



# National Association of Basketball Coaches NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Rankings

## 2014-15 Rankings – Feb. 3, 2015 (Poll #10)

KANSAS CITY, Mo. – A pair of road losses suffered by last week's top-ranked team has moved the final undefeated team in NCAA Division II, Lincoln Memorial, into the top position in the new NABC/Division II rankings.

The Railsplitters, 20-0 on the season, reached the top of the poll after winning games over Brevard and Coker while last week's No. 1 team, Indianapolis, lost on the road to Wisconsin-Parkside and Lewis.

Lincoln Memorial is in the top spot on the poll for the second time in school history; its previous reign at the top lasted just a week in January 2012. Since that week, the top-ranked team in the nation has come from only three conferences – the Great Lakes Valley Conference, Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference or Mountain East (or previous members of the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference).

The next seven spots in the rankings all went to teams that also moved up a spot as a result of UIndy's loss, starting with two teams that will face off Wednesday, Florida Southern and Barry. Barry, who will host the matchup, won the first meeting at FSC.

Augustana moved up to fourth and also has a big matchup on tap this week, hosting No. 6 Minnesota State-Moorhead Saturday -- a day after facing an 18-4 Northern State team. Bellarmine is ranked right between the two NSIC teams in fifth.

Angelo State is seventh this week, followed by Colorado-Colorado Springs and Indianapolis. The next four spots went unchanged, starting with West Liberty at No. 10, followed by Metropolitan State, Tarleton State and Colorado School of Mines.

Wisconsin-Parkside handed UIndy its first loss last Thursday and vaulted six spots to 14<sup>th</sup> as a result. Mount Olive remained at No. 15, while BYU-Hawaii moved up a spot to 16<sup>th</sup> after wins over ranked Azusa Pacific and California Baptist teams last week.

Ferris State is 17<sup>th</sup> this week, followed by Indiana (Pa.), Azusa Pacific and Great Northwest Athletic Conference leader Western Oregon.

The final five teams in this week's poll include four that were outside the top 25 last week, headed by No. 21 Lake Superior State. UNC Pembroke dropped to No. 22, while Midwestern State, West Georgia and Central Missouri round out this week's rankings.

The next poll will be released Feb. 10.
