Weekly Poll Notes:

Colorado School of Mines continues to hold the top spot in the NABC/Division II national poll – the fifth consecutive week that the Orediggers have the top spot – as the poll saw little movement in the top half this week.

The top five spots remained the same this week, with Northern State at No. 2, Northwest Missouri State at No. 3 – those teams received first place votes along with Colorado School of Mines – Lincoln Memorial at No. 4 and West Texas A&M at No. 5.

For the second straight week, the first change came at No. 6 as the result of Hillsdale's win over Findlay on Saturday. The loss dropped Findlay to 12th behind Hillsdale, as all of the team ranked a week ago from seventh (Truman State) to 12th (Hillsdale) all moved up one spot.

The only newcomer to the top 10 as a result of that movement was Alabama Huntsville, who extended its winning streak to eight games after sweeping West Alabama on the road over the weekend.

Four newcomers joined the rankings this week and three of them are in for the first time this season. Flagler, the current leader in the Peach Belt Conference, entered the rankings at No. 21 and is ranked for the first time as a member of NCAA Division II. Current Mountain East Conference leader Charleston also joined the top 25 at No. 22, a spot ahead of conference mate West Liberty. Undefeated Gannon is the third first-time entry at No. 24.

A total of eight conferences have multiple teams in the rankings again this week, with four of them coming from the Lone Star Conference and three from the Gulf South Conference.
