Weekly Poll Notes:

The top five spots went unchanged in the first NABC/Division II men's basketball rankings for the 2021 calendar year, with Northwest Missouri State continuing to sit atop the poll heading into a Thursday matchup against fifth-ranked Washburn. Both teams picked up wins as they returned to play last week, although Washburn needed overtime to win Saturday at Northeastern State.

Lincoln Memorial knocked off then-No. 24 Tusculum on Saturday and remains at No. 2 this week, while West Texas A&M stays at No. 3 as it returns to the floor Tuesday night when it hosts Oklahoma Baptist in a non-conference game. Colorado School of Mines held at No. 4 and escaped Black Hills State's upset bid Monday night with an overtime victory to stay undefeated.

Two teams in last week's top 10 suffered losses and fell into the second 10 in the poll as a result. Truman State lost at Maryville on Thursday and dropped six spots to 13th, while St. Edward's lost the first of its two contests at MSU Texas and fell from ninth to 17th. The Hilltoppers did avenge that setback with an overtime win on Sunday over the previously unbeaten Mustangs.

A total of nine conferences have multiple teams in the rankings this week. The Lone Star Conference has four representatives in West Texas A&M, No. 17 St. Edward's, No. 21 DBU and No. 24 Lubbock Christian, the lone newcomer to the rankings this week.

Meanwhile, the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association is represented by a trio of teams in Northwest Missouri State, Washburn and No. 22 Missouri Western.
