Weekly Poll Notes:

Following a wild week of action in NCAA Division II, Lubbock Christian still has a hold of the top spot in the latest NABC/Division II men's basketball rankings after a seven-day period that saw 12 ranked teams from a week ago lose a game – including nine of the top 13.

Lubbock Christian beat St. Edward's in its only contest last week, but Northwest Missouri State lost in overtime at Central Oklahoma and Cal State San Marcos suffered the same fate at Cal State San Bernardino, which moved Nova Southeastern to the second spot, Cal State San Bernardino to third and Indiana (Pa.) to fourth.

Northwest and CSU San Marcos stayed at the top end of the rankings despite their losses, as Northwest fell to fifth and CSUSM to sixth. However, losses by every team ranked from seventh through 13th last week created a huge shakeup in the remainder of the poll.

Mountain East Conference rivals Fairmont State and West Liberty both moved back into the top 10 at seventh and eighth, respectively, while Central Oklahoma rose nine spots to ninth with its win over Northwest. Another new entry to the top 10 this week is UNC Pembroke, who has won 12 straight to take the 10th spot this week.

Two new teams join the rankings from last week. Flagler came in at No. 23 following its win Saturday over then-No. 17 Augusta, which was the Saints' 13th win in their last 14 contests. The other is West Alabama, who is ranked for the first time this season at No. 25.

With Truman State dropping out of the Top 25, the Great Lakes Valley Conference is without a team among the top 25 in the national poll for the first time since Jan. 23, 1989. The GLVC has had one team in the rankings in each of the last 403 polls prior to this week.
