Game Notes:

Indiana is making its first Elite Eight appearance since 2010, when it lost in the national championship game to Cal Poly Pomona and sixth overall. The Crimson Hawks advanced to the semifinal round on three of those prior trips, also doing so in 1995 and 2002.

Azusa Pacific has made the Elite Eight in its first season of NCAA Division II eligibility and second-ever school to do so; Lynn also pulled the feat in 1997. The Cougars are also the first team since Bowie State in 2003 and ninth overall since 1989 to make the national quarterfinals in their first NCAA Tournament appearance.

Indiana has been deadly at the free throw line this season, ranking third in Division II at 78.3 percent. Three regular starters – Devante Chance, Jeremy Jeffers and Brandon Norfleet – are over 80 percent on the year. Norfleet hit the three-point shot with seven seconds remaining to beat four-time Atlantic Regional champ West Liberty to send the Crimson Hawks to Evansville.

The Cougars have only two players who are averaging in double figures, but one of them is Troy Leaf, the nation's seventh-leading scorer. Leaf, whose 23.4 points per game is the most of anyone playing in this year's Elite Eight, averaged 29.7 points during APU's run to the West Regional title.

IUP's Shawn Dyer is playing in his fourth straight Elite Eight, having played the last three at West Liberty. Dyer, who is a graduate student at IUP, led his team with 23 points in the regional final win over WLU.
