# **Game Notes:**

Indiana (Pa.) and Tarleton State are meeting for the first time ever in their national quarterfinal matchup.

IUP is in the semifinal round for the first time since 2010, when it beat St. Cloud State 76-70 to reach the national championship game (it lost to Cal Poly Pomona). The other two semifinal appearances for the Crimson Hawks came in 1995 and 2002.

Tarleton State reached the national semifinals in 2005, where it lost to Bryant 60-55. The 18-point win recorded by the Texans in the semifinal round marked the third straight season in which a team won a quarterfinal round game by at least 18 points.

The Crimson Hawks, who got 17 points from Devante Chance in its 69-65 win over Azusa Pacific, have won 10 of their last 11 games.

Tarleton State had a balanced scoring effort in the 77-59 win over Mount Olive, led by Mo Lee's 15 points. Lee's three-point basket with 9:34 to play sparked a decisive 11-0 run, as the Texans extended a four-point lead to 15.

IUP's Shawn Dyer is playing in the national semifinals for the third straight year; he played in this round in the last two seasons at West Liberty.
