Bellarmine and Florida Southern are meeting for the second time this season and third time overall. The Moccasins beat the Knights 101-96 in overtime in Louisville on Dec. 13, behind 25 points from Kevin Capers and 21 from Stephen Battle. Jake Thelen had 29 to lead Bellarmine. The Knights won the other prior meeting early in the 2008-09 season.

Bellarmine is in the national semifinals for the third time and first since 2012, when it lost to Montevallo. The other trip to the semis for the Knights was in their national championship season in 2011; BU beat Minnesota State in that contest.

Florida Southern has played in six previous national semifinal games and won twice – including their national championship season of 1981. The other final four trip for the Moccasins came the year prior to that in 1980, when they lost to Virginia Union in the semifinals and ended up taking third place.

This is the second time in three years that two teams are meeting in the national semifinals in a rematch of a regular season matchup. Drury beat Western Washington in the semis in 2013 after losing to the Vikings during the regular season.
