Point Loma, the seventh different West Regional champion in the last seven years, captured a win in its first national quarterfinal on Wednesday in just its second NCAA Tournament. ... PLNU, who with a win Thursday would tie its single season record for victories, has one of the most experienced lineups in Evansville with four seniors and a junior who have started every game this year. ... The one junior, Daulton Hommes, leads the Sea Lions in scoring at 21.8 points per game and is the nation's third-best three-point shooter with a mark of 47.9 percent. ... Point Loma's 41.8 percent mark from beyond the arc is the second-best in Division II, while it is third in overall field goal percentage at 51.9 percent. ... The Sea Lions were the only team entering the Elite Eight averaging at least 10 more rebounds than their opponents; they have outrebounded their foes in 31 of their 34 contests this season.

Southern Indiana returned to the Elite Eight for the first time in 15 seasons and knocked off its third straight top 25 team by beating West Texas A&M in the quarterfinals...Alex Stein, one of two 2,000-point scorers in this year's Elite Eight with 2,197 points, followed up his 33-point showing in the Midwest Regional final with a 31-point effort Wednesday; he averages a team-high 20.9 points per game. ... The Screaming Eagles rank fourth in Division II with 597 made free throws and shoot 75.9 percent from the charity stripe on the year. ... USI is the only team in this year's field that has not had a winning streak of more than five games this season -- a win Thursday would be its fifth straight -- but ended Bellarmine's 67-game home winning streak Feb. 2 with an 80-76 win... USI is the first team to play in an Elite Eight in its home city since the NCAA went to the single site for the national quarterfinals in 1989.
